## *Pumpkin Sale in Jeopardy*

Typically the troop needs to raise at least \$1000 to avoid increased dues.

## *Fishing Campout/Tom's Eagle Project*

On the weekend of Sep. 16-18, we have a 'work before play' campout. Thomas Vlasak is planning to complete his Eagle project on the morning of Sep. 17. The project consists of building a campsite along the North Country Trail (<http://northcountrytrail.org/>). Tasks will include hauling tools and supplies to the location, clearing brush, leveling tent sites, establishing spur trails, and placing a fire ring, latrine, and signage. Once the work is done, boys will have another chance to test their fishing skills on beautiful Bad Medicine or other nearby lakes. The troop will "camp" at the Vlasak family farmhouse ... some of you will remember having visited there before. Thomas asks that you bring sturdy work or hiking boots and water bottles. In addition, please bring your fishing gear, life vest, work gloves, and safety glasses if you have them, but most of these items can be provided if you don't have your own. Permission slips will be due Sep. 6.
